Steam Era Model kits

It may be astonishing to some, but there are model kits produced in Australia, Phillip Island in fact. So they are not only Australian made, but Victorian made.

These kits are in the rail modelling HO scale, 76th Scale in scale modelling terms. All subjects are of Victorian rolling stock, era is late 19th century to the present. Pricing for these kits start around \$16:00 so they are quite affordable. The company also produces the paints for the subjects.

Profile- CA-2/CA-6 Wackett

This was Australia's first mass produced aircraft and the first indigenous design to go into production. The Wackett was a primary trainer and partner to the CAC Wirraway advanced trainer.

The aircraft suffered from a number of design flaws including being nose heavy and difficult to fly for a primary trainer. Production stopped in 1942 in favor of Boomerang production, and the type was phased out of service by 1945 in favor of the DH Tiger Moth after Australian production of the DH product had began.

30 were transferred to the Dutch East Indies/Indonesian Airforce after WWII. Today only four examples remain, none airworthy, the most notable one being in the collection of the National Australian Aviation Museum."
